Loughborough Junction is located between Brixton, Camberwell and Herne Hill. It takes its name from a rail station.

The area has been neglected, partly as a result of unrealised planning decisions, partly because it is on the very edge of Lambeth and halfway between the busier centres of Brixton and Camberwell. Nevertheless it contains a vibrant community who have formed an action group to attempt to bring about the improvement and regeneration of the area.

**November 2008** Creation of the Loughborough Junction Action Group (LJAG)

**December 2008** LJAG organises guerrilla bulb planting around Loughborough Junction

**March-June 2009** LJAG successfully raises funding for 11 trees and 2 planters to be planted around Loughborough Junction Station.

**September 2009** LJAG obtains the installation of a Community Notice Board outside the Loughborough Junction station, maintained by LJAG volunteers.

**February 2010** LJAG partners with SE5 Forum mount 'We are Loughborough Junction', an innovative outdoor photographic exhibition featuring portraits of local people.

**Feb-March 2010** LJAG successfully gathers 500 signatures towards a free emergency bus shuttle between Camberwell & Brixton during the Coldharbour Lane 6-week road closure.



**April 2010** launch of the Loughborough Junction in Bloom competition for most beautiful front garden.

**July 2010** Loughborough Junction in Bloom street party in Harbour Road.

**September 2010** LJAG launches the 7 Bridges project, a major regeneration project around Loughborough Junction.



**October 2010:** LJAG successfully lobbies to get the section 106 artwork on the future Fabrik building visible to the public, and helps select the artwork.

**November 2010** Launch of 7 Bridges project to local councillors, and key Lambeth officers, Transport for London, Groundwork and the Cross River Partnership.

**December 2010** Lambeth Council undertake to make public realm investment in area in conjunction with local community.

**December 2010** Successful bid for seed corn finance to support 7 Bridges project to Capital Community Foundation of £4,875 to pay for part-time project officer.

**January 2011** Lois Acton appointed as project officer.

**January 2011** LJAG attends Loughborough Speaks, a local consultation event.

**January 2011** Successful bid to Lambeth Forums Network for £2,600 to set up office for project officer and related expenditure and website development

**January 2011** onwards. Engagement with schools, schools cluster organiser, Lambeth Music Service, Basement Jaxx, Ebony Horse Club, Thorlands Estate, Milkwood Estate, Lilford Residents Association, Loughborough EMB. Fundraising.

**April 2011.** Successful bid for £10,000 from Awards for All to fund mosaic work with schools, art work, and street party around the Cambria Bridge, as part of the 7 Bridges pilot project.

**June 2011** 7 Bridges Festival over weekend of 3,4,5 June.
